It is currently 9:25 am on Election Day, November 5, 2024. The country is pretty energized and pretty exhausted and pretty much anything could happen in the next 72 hours or so. Our nation is being offered two vastly different leadership plans and I really don't know who will prevail, but I do know this: that my life allegiance is not to a party or an ideology or even to my country, a country I love. My allegiance, as a pastor and as a Christian, is to Christ.

No one could ever legitimately say that Christianity is easy, but it is simple. Jesus basically had just two wide planks in his platform, the same two he proclaimed when asked about the most important, the most weighty, the most binding of all the commandments. And though there were two –

love of God and love of neighbor – it is pretty simple to reduce them to one, the commandment to love. That's it. The foundation of our faith, the core of our identity, the reason we get up in the morning. **Love.** Simple? Yes! But easy? Not remotely...

Our inescapable political reality has surely contributed mightily to making loving one another less easy. Both sides have encouraged the American infighting in their own particular ways, because an energized, polarized electorate will possibly actually get out and vote! Since the days of Machiavelli politicians have known and embraced the value of controversy, fearmongering, exaggeration, and other 'motivational' tactics as tools to advance their own agendas. It is now several hundred years in practice and seems unlikely to ever leave the stage, which

complicates things considerably for us Christian folk.

Because, despite the endless complexity and speculation and projection of scenarios, our agenda is simple. Our agenda is to demonstrate the superior way of Love as the arbiter of human interactions. And when we are actively encouraged to distrust one another, to suspect one another, to revile and demonize and even persecute one another, Love is harder to demonstrate and model and engage in. And if there was ever a litmus test for loving one another here in America, I think that the next week or so of our communal lives will be that test. Worse in its own ways than the Civil War and both World Wars and all the international conflicts we have seen since the founding of our nation, worse because we are deluged continuously to feel and act and behave badly. This may advance the agenda of whoever wins our national election, but it hardly advances the cause of Christ.

So, even though everything is so uncertain right now, at 9:48 on Tuesday, November 5, 2024, there is one thing that I believe to be dependable and essential and redemptive: that our mandate, despite all of the world's distraction, is to love. This was not and never was a biblical sugges-

tion – it is a commandment! It will not be easy, but it still can be simple. Whatever others do in the next days and weeks, we need to be about Love.
